Three unlikely friends take control of their office and learn there is nothing they can't do, even in a man's world. Set in the late 1970s, this hilarious story of friendship and revenge in the Rolodex era is outrageous, thought-provoking, and even romantic. Pushed to the boiling point, three female coworkers concoct a plan to get even with the sexist, egotistical, lying, hypocritical bigot they call their boss. In a hilarious turn of events, Violet, Judy, and Doralee live out

their wildest fantasy – giving their boss the boot! While Hart remains "otherwise engaged," the women give their workplace a dream makeover, taking control of the company that had always kept them down.

- Josh/Jess (Male or Female, 15-18) Violet's bit of a stoner teenager. Loves and thinks highly of their mom.
- Missy (Female, 20-35) Franklin Hart's wife, unaware of her husband's true nature. Deserves better.
- Maria (Female, 20-30) A young and vibrant secretary in Hart's office. Vocal range top: D5, Vocal range bottom: F4.
